ACTION YOU MUST TAKE:

INSTRUMENTS

Please make sure that your instrument is in proper working condition. Repair concert and marching instruments before August. Please check-out marching instruments before pre-camp. Instruments will be available Monday, August 2, beginning at 1:00 P.M. If you are not contacted before, your instrument will not be ready until then.

MUSIC

Music will be available as you come in. Please bring a flip folder and extra windows. A portion of the marching music may be provided before summer recess if show music is completed.

HEALTH FORM

Complete the health form in its entirety and return before summer break. Health information and parental consent areas are vital. All information is confidential.

SCHEDULE

Post the schedule in a conspicuous spot. Your participation in all events is expected and a contract of membership. Clear your schedules now.

FEES & DEPOSIT

The 2010 Camp Fee is \$290.00. The following schedule is expected:

REHEARSALS

August 2, 3, 4, and 5. (Monday through Thursday)

The following Charlotte camp schedule will be followed:

6:00 p.m. – 6:45 p.m. Incoming freshmen & new members with the drum major.

7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. Full rehearsals (all members) in the high school band room &/or drill.

ARRIVE BEFORE 7:00 p.m.

Please take care of all equipment problems, music, fees etc. before rehearsal. Remember that rehearsals start at 7:00 p.m. -- arriving at 7:00 p.m. is too late.

UNIFORMS

Uniform issue will take place the week of August 2 at 1:00 P.M. (seniors on Monday, juniors on Tuesday, sophomores on Wednesday, and freshmen on Thursday.) Students must provide their own regulation band shoes. Regulation Band Shoes must be all black, tie, plain toe, with heel. A shoe order form is provided. Shoes must be ordered by August 6. Send shoe orders to the P.O. Box or rehearsal with \$25.00.

RULES FOR CAMP

Review these with parents or guardian. You will sign a student pledge.

PHYSICAL CONDITIONING

A marching band is a strenuous physical activity. The success of our band is determined by how well you can march and play at the same time. Since field shows require continuous physical activity, you must start now by getting into good shape to be able to give the maximum in air support and marching all the way to the end of a performance.

TAG YOUR LUGGAGE, EQUIPMENT & BEDROLL

Mark all luggage and equipment with luggage tags. Pack a bedroll with care and tie it securely. (Include two sheets and two blankets) Do not take sleeping bags to camp. Cabins stay neat when beds must be made. Part of our tradition is the camp inspection.

REMEMBER THESE THINGS TO TAKE TO CAMP

Take your pillow on the bus with you. Pajamas, bathing suits, earplugs, nose plugs, etc., hangers for clothing, one suitcase per person. Students are allowed one "carry-on" case for the bus. Each group will need an alarm clock, flashlight, etc. Take stamps, toothbrush, soap, band-aids, sun screen, Blistex, Chap Stick, personal medicines (see rules), and a pencil for marking music. Make sure that you have a comfortable pair of shoes for marching and wear socks with them. Take care of the little things yourself (blisters, etc.) You will need flip folders (with at least 10 windows), lyres, and music. Flip folders will be available at the high school, or you can buy a flip folder from a music dealer. Be sure the flip is all black in color.

MEALS

Meals will be served cafeteria style. Always clean your table after dinner or evening snacks. If you fail to do this, your whole table may miss recreation to assist in the cleaning of the dining area. Don't "load up" your tray as you go through the line, but go back for seconds if you need more. No eating or drinking contests, etc.

SWIMMING

There will be supervised swimming each day. Everyone must pass a swim test to go into the water. Those who do not pass will stay inside the designated area. Check in and out every time that you go swimming. You will lose your swimming privilege if you don't follow this procedure. No horseplay in the water or on the dock. The WSI will give more complete instructions at camp.

EXTRA PHYSICAL CONDITIONING

Any student desiring or requiring extra physical conditioning will be allowed to jog around the field area during the recreation periods. This activity must be under the supervision of the staff. No special "training" schedules can be accommodated. The camp is not licensed for any contact sports, touch football, basketball, etc. Band recreation times are intended to be used as mental relaxation times for student well-being and a deserved break from the rigor of the instructional program. This time is not to be redirected toward organized athletic, cheer, dance, or other like programs.

VISITORS

Due to the size of the band and our full schedule of activities, it is difficult to accommodate visitors at camp. **DO NOT INVITE BOY FRIENDS OR GIRL FRIENDS TO CAMP. THEY WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE IF THEY COME.** There is no room for overnight visitors at camp. There will be no opportunity for special visits to or outside of the camp. State camping regulations require screening of all staff and prohibit unauthorized personnel coming in contact with students.

NIGHT PROCEDURES

After evening rehearsals, we will have planned activities. You are expected to take part. You are not to go to cabins or rooms except in emergencies and must ask permission of the nurse, or your counselor. A counselor must go with you. The taking of evening showers is to be cleared with the dorm supervisors and will not extend the evening curfew. At 10:00 P.M. you should be in your cabin or section. Lights out at 10:15 P.M. After this, any activity will be dealt with accordingly. (Refer to rules)

PARENTS OF SENIORS ATTENDING THE FRIDAY LUNCHEON

Due to the capacity of the center, Friday's Senior Luncheon is limited to the families of seniors. We must know before we go to camp if parents are going to eat with us. A sign-up form will be available from the band boosters. Parents will pay the dinner fee of \$10.50 per adult and \$8.00 per child under 12 by August 6. I urge all parents to come for our Friday performance. We will perform material prepared during the week. The Friday performance will begin about 1:00 P.M. in the afternoon, and the camp will be dismissed immediately following this performance.

BOUNDARY LINES

The dormitory, edge of the field, and road entrance to camp are the boundary lines. Any activity outside of planned recreation must be approved.

MONEY

Keep it with you. If not, check to see if your counselor will keep it for you. Do not leave it around or you will lose it. Vending machines will be available.

SWIM SUITS

Swimwear is for beach and sunbathing only. Do not wear in the center, to meals, or to marching rehearsals. Conservative dress is expected.

PRE-MEAL GATHERING

At each meal, we have traditionally said the following generic prayer, led by the drum major: "Dear God, Bless This Food To Our Bodies And This Camp To Thy Service." If anyone objects to this, please notify me right away. A moment of silence will be substituted, if necessary.

INSPECTION

The following preparation must be followed for our daily inspections: Swing bed clothing over foot of bed and allow to air during breakfast. Smooth sheets and tuck around mattress at foot and sides of bedspread. Smooth blankets and tuck under mattress at the bed's foot, then tuck in the sides, squaring corners at foot of mattress. Fluff and lay your pillow at the head of your bed. Tuck open under pillow neatly. Fold extra blanket uniformly and neatly lay across the foot of the bed. Sweep floors, walls, and dust ledges each day. Close and place suitcases at foot of bed. Place shoes beside suitcases in pairs. Place clothing on hangers and hang neatly on hooks, all turned the same way. Button coats, shirts, and jackets. Pile newspapers, magazines neatly on shelves or tables. Hang towels, washcloths, and bathing suits on clotheslines, allow to dry, then hang on hangers. Pick up grounds around your area. Return empty bottles or juice containers to lodge. Failure to conform will result in loss of soft drink privileges. Make final check before you leave area to inspection. **IF YOUR INSPECTION RATING IS LOW ON THESE TEN POINTS, YOU WILL DO YOUR AREA AGAIN DURING RECREATION.**

EMERGENCY MEDICAL INFORMATION

Parents, please fill out the enclosed health form and return this form with the data and pledge forms before pre-season rehearsals. This is a form that is required by the State of Michigan for our camp and will be used for the entire year, including tours, and any off-campus band travel. Also, if a student is taking any medication, we must have parental or guardian permission for our camp nurse to dispense the medication. Health information is confidential and will be available to authorized personnel, only. Requests to use the health form for other school activities during the year will be denied. The form is a part of the State inspection profile. Student personal information and our notations are confidential and unrelated to other trips.

DO NOT TAKE THESE OR SIMILAR ITEMS TO CAMP

Large sound systems, instrument amplifiers, television sets, individual coolers on the bus, water guns, skateboards, scooters, or any other item that interferes with the objectives or operation of the camp will not be allowed. One small stereo per room is allowed. If it causes a disruption, it is not allowed. Students will be given guidelines pertaining to the use of cell phones.

ABSOLUTE POLICY AGAINST HAZING

The Charlotte High School Band is a positive organization where all members are valued for their contribution to the total ensemble. No student will be subjected to any physical activity construed as hazing. This activity is to be reported to Dr. Sullivan, immediately, and it will be dealt with appropriately. Students who violate minor rules might be introduced to the group at dinner and asked to sing a song or walk the tables. An attempt will be made to introduce freshmen to the group, in a positive fashion, through the use of nametags, etc. Any student who is uncomfortable with the band's mealtime bonding traditions is not required to participate. New members will enjoy a very positive induction where they learn of the traditions and history of the Charlotte Bands, and join the decades of membership known as the "unending chain of musicians." The band staff will not allow any hazing activities.

REHEARSAL CONSIDERATIONS

Be on time to rehearsals. Bring all music and charts to rehearsals. The band does not have time to wait for people who forget things in the dorms. An efficient band camp provides for a smoother fall rehearsal schedule.

BAND CAMP IS A REQUIRED ACTIVITY FOR ALL STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN THE CHARLOTTE HIGH SCHOOL BAND PROGRAM. Band Camp is an integral part of the high school band music curriculum. Students will return from camp having learned necessary skills and a major portion of the fall marching program. The band performs, often, before the official start of school. The camp routine from check-in through the exit performance is important. Requests to come late or leave early conflict with the successful operation of the camp. **The camp requirement is for the entire camp week.**

Band Camp is a positive, historical, yet required aspect of the Charlotte High School Band. Therefore, financial need shall not be a reason for a student not participating. Cases of real and verifiable need should be directed to the Band Boosters.

LAB BAND

If any student has not attained the necessary musical skills demonstrated by audition, is unable to demonstrate responsibility through attendance at rehearsals and performances, exhibits poor rehearsal discipline, or fails to meet the band camp attendance requirement, he or she may be required to participate in Lab Band.

Check-in with the bus chaperone, board the bus, and stay in your seat. **DO NOT HANG AROUND ON THE SIDEWALK UNTIL YOU ARE FORCED TO BOARD. THIS HAS DELAYED OUR DEPARTURE IN THE PAST!**

CAMP ARRIVAL PROCEDURES

Report to the dorms and cabins and prepare for swim tests. You will have 15 minutes to put your room in order. (Counselors will supervise.) A swim test and health screening with camp staff and our nurse will take place when you arrive. Go to the nurse's station before the swim test. The Health Screening will consist of the checking in of all prescription drugs and medications. A review of the Camper Health History and emergency forms will take place. A discussion with the camper to determine any special needs will be a part of the screening. The Kettunen Center Staff will explain water rules and regulations and conduct the swim tests.

After the health screening and swim tests, all band members should change into drill clothes, attend dinner and prepare for the Sunday evening rehearsal.

➤ **Instrument Inventory, Check-out & Repairs:**

◆ Instrument issue

High School Band School Instruments will be issued by Dr. Sullivan only. Since the summer is a very busy repair time for the instrument repair companies, do not expect your instrument before the August band rehearsals, unless other arrangements have been made. Sometimes, instruments are issued prior to the June recess.

◆ Repair of School-owned instruments

Charlotte High School utilizes the professional services of Meridian Winds for school repairs. Unless specific arrangements are made, repairs on school instruments should be sent to Meridian Winds through Dr. Sullivan.

◆ Repair of Student-owned instruments

Student-owned instruments can be sent to the repair shops through the high school band office. Payment for the cost of those repairs is the responsibility of students and parents. Unless otherwise requested, your name, address, & phone number will be given to the company represented & they will call you with an estimate if requested. Meridian Winds will pick-up and deliver from school. The “turn around” time is one week unless special arrangements are made. Personal summer repairs can be taken to Meridian Winds, conveniently located across the street from Okemos H.S. on Jolly Rd.

➤ **Music**

- ◆ Music concerns should be directed to the designated Band Librarian. Usually a student aid, the librarian will help you with part problems, emergency copies, etc. Music will be ordered, organized, and written in the summer. If possible, music will be sent to students before camp.

➤ **Band Supply & Summer Supply Ordering**

◆ Band Camp Supply Items

Students will have the opportunity to purchase band supply items when you come to the August camp. Meridian Winds in Okemos, Marshall Music at Frandor and have supplies in their retail stores. Online purchases may be made at the Woodwind-Brasswind – wwbw.com.

General Band Supply Items

General band supply items, including reeds, oil, flip folders, etc. are available in the band office. You are charged the cost the band pays for these items and are expected to pay before receiving the items. (Refer to the supply list for a complete list and prices.) The prices may change without notice to reflect the price that we pay for band supplies.

Buy supplies before the morning session bell, not before class. You may also obtain supply items from a variety of music stores. You must, however, perform with our **approved list of mouthpieces & supplies.**

➤ **Uniform Issue & Inventory:**

- ◆ Call the uniform chairs with shoe needs, uniform needs and concerns--including sizing issues. They maintain the inventory records for school-owned band uniforms and arrange for cleaning and alterations. The Booster Uniform Chair for the 2010– 2011 school year is:

➤ **Band Uniform Alterations**

The school-designated tailor will be available during summer uniform issue to provide uniform alteration support. Any band uniform alteration needs should be directed to this person, who will be at the pre-season 1:00 p.m. fittings. The 2011 alteration contact is: Anne Welling – 543-6031

➤ **Housing & Bus Lists:**

- ◆ Assistant Director of Bands, Mr. Gronda, will coordinate the housing and organize the bus lists for camp. Contact him with any changes and your housing concerns.

➤ **Band Camp Health Issues:**

- ◆ The Band Camp & Trip Health Forms should be returned to **Dr. Sullivan**. Health information will be organized and maintained for the entire school year. These forms are not available to students for any other activity.
- ◆ Any Band Camp health issues, notations to the health form, explanation of special conditions, medications, etc. should be directed to the Band Camp Health team in writing. Phil Wallace is in charge of camp health.

➤ **Private Lessons**

- ◆ The private lesson program is coordinated by Assistant Band Director Ms. Detgen. Call her at the Junior High Band Office. She will schedule you with a teacher & provide all of the appropriate details.

➤ **Freshmen Band Mentors**

- ◆ All freshmen band members will be teamed with an older band mentor or section leader. The band mentor will answer questions, introduce the students to the ways of the band, and generally be a “new friend” in band at the high school. The upper class mentors will be trained to be supportive, call the students in advance, and generally answer questions.

CHS Band Uniform Requirements

The school supplies marching coats and pants, shakos (hat), plumes, flag corps uniforms, drum major uniforms, white flag corps boots, and white drum major shoes for the marching band. Black tuxedo coats and pants are supplied for concert season.

Students must supply the following (personal) items:

- Band Shoes – black, tie, plain toe, with heel
- Band Socks – black dress crew sox (suntan nylons for marching flag corps)
- Band Gloves – white nylon or cotton gloves for all winds and percussion except snares and quads, sure grip white gloves for flag corps, flash gloves for drum majors.
- Tuxedo Shirt & Tie (for concert season) – white winged collar tux shirt and banded bow tie.

Where to obtain uniform accessories

Band Shoes must be ordered before July 1. An order form will be available. Formal wear may be purchased from tuxedo shops or department stores. Additionally, information for local locations will be provided in the fall. Students must obtain formal wear accessories before the December concerts.

Final uniform cleaning fee

All students will be issued a uniform that has been through the dry cleaning process. The care and cleaning of the uniform during the school year is the responsibility of the band student. A \$20.00 fee is collected in the summer to pay the cost of the final cleaning of the uniform after the Memorial Day collection.

Uniform cleaning

The uniforms should be cleaned regularly at the designated cleaning facility.

General Guidelines

- All or none of the uniform must be worn
- Students should not wear any hat other than the shako
- Excessive make-up and jewelry is not allowed
- Posts – girls with pierced ears—no “dangly” ear wear
- Shoes must shine
- The band pants must extend to the shoe and not break
- Uniform coats must not be worn “open”.
- While in concert uniform, the ties must be worn at all times
- Uniforms should be stored in a uniform garment bag and never allowed to touch the ground or the floor
- Raincoats will be issued and collected when needed
- Plumes will be issued and collected on performance days

BAND CAMP RULES STUDENT PLEDGE

The State of Michigan and the Kettunen Center requires that our camp operate according to specific rules and regulations. Additionally, students are bound by the Charlotte High School handbook and band rules. Students are required to read the following and sign at the bottom.

STUDENT CAMPER NAME: _____

1. Students may not leave camp for any reason with any person without Dr. Sullivan's permission.
 2. Students are to participate in the scheduled activities as a group and not "pair-off" to isolated areas.
 3. Students will respect the "lights out" time and avoid talking and other disturbances after taps. Everyone must be in his or her room by 9:45 PM.
 4. Everyone will observe the one-hour rest period after lunch. You must stay on your own bunk, read, or write letters. Avoid talking.
 5. Students are bound by all school rules including rules pertaining to smoking, drinking, and substance abuse. The Charlotte High School student handbook applies at camp.
 6. Camp nurses must dispense and log all medications. Do not take any medications (even over-the-counter) on your own. Students are not to keep any medications.
 7. Students must not visit the cabins or rooms of the opposite sex for any reason.
 8. Practical jokes and pranks are not allowed.
 9. Hazing activities will not be tolerated. Respect for one another is expected.
 10. Students are not to be in the rooms unsupervised and are not allowed on floors other than their own.
 11. No special schedules will be accommodated. All students must rise at the scheduled time and shower at the scheduled times.
 12. Due to safety concerns, facilities, and supervision, only prescribed recreational activities and state licensed activities are to take place. We are unable to accommodate activities like touch football, etc. Students who wish to augment their training; jog, etc. may do so during recreation periods.
 13. Students are expected to clear and clean their tables in the dining room. All dining room procedures must follow Kettunen Center expectations.
 14. Students must dress appropriately for camp. A good pair of shoes and sox must be worn at all times. Students should dress comfortably but tastefully.
 15. Students must protect themselves from the sun and apply the appropriate sun protection. Students should wear a hat.
 16. Camp procedures must be followed at the waterfront. Students should not leave the designated swim area and must respect all lifeguard commands.
 17. Students need to leave cell phones at home.
 18. Students are to respond to adult directives the first time without question.
 19. Students are not to take any inappropriate items to camp.
 20. Students who engage in any improper activity may be denied leadership roles in the band, and/or denied consideration for band honors and awards. Depending on the severity of inappropriate activity, students may be demoted in their role in the band, suspended, or dismissed. In severe cases involving illegal activity or the use of illegal drugs, school administration and/or law enforcement may be contacted. Students may be subject to immediate dismissal from camp and removal from the band.
