

CURRENT LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Deadline 3/23/2006—CPS SCHOOL EMPLOYEES SCHOLARSHIP — These scholarships have been created from contributions by various Charlotte Public School employees. Students will be selected to be interviewed. Pick up an application in the High School Guidance Office.

Deadline 3/31/2006—The Patrick Cicorelli Educational Scholarship through the Knights of Columbus. You must be a registered parishioner of St. Mary's Church to apply. Other criteria also applies. Applications are in the High School Guidance Office.

Deadline 4/15/2006—John W. Duris Scholarship by the Charlotte Optimist Club. This scholarship is awarded to Eaton County students involved in the Eaton Intermediate School District's Vocational Program who are pursuing a vocational-technical course in an accredited school or college leading to a Technical Associate Degree, certification or diploma, but less than a Bachelor of Arts or Science degree. Selection is based on high school academic performance. This is a one-year, \$750 scholarship. Applications are in the Guidance Office.

Deadline 4/21/2006—Eaton Intermediate School District Educational Association Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to an Eaton County school district student who has been at the Lansing Community College Career Preparation Center or associated off-campus program in the last year and who is pursuing a vocational-technical course in an accredited school or college leading to a Technical Associate degree, certification or diploma, but less than a Bachelor of Arts or Science degree. Selection is based on need and high school academic performance. This is a one year, \$250 scholarship. Applications are in the Guidance Office.

Deadline 3/15/2006 – American Legion Auxiliary Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship is available to daughters, granddaughters and great-granddaughters of any honorably discharged or deceased men/women veterans. Applicant must be a resident of the State of Michigan. Deadline 3/15/2006—The Michigan State Troopers Assistance Fund has a scholarship to reward those students who are actively involved in extra curricular activities, community service and and jobs that make

them productive members of their communities. You must have at least a 3.25 GPA and have filed the FAFSA. A copy of the application is available in the Guidance Office.

Deadline 3/16/2006—American Legion Auxiliary Medical Career Scholarship. The American Legion Auxiliary Medical Career \$500 Scholarship is offered to men and women pursuing medical careers. Candidates shall be daughters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters, sons, grandsons, great-grandsons, or step of the aforementioned, wives or widows of honorably discharged or deceased men or women veterans who served during the following dates:

Deadline 3/18/2006—Kellogg Community College's Gold Key Scholarships. Kellogg Community College's Gold Key Scholarships are fully funded scholarships in the amount of \$6,000. Recipients are awarded \$2,500 annually for two years with an additional \$1,000 available for continuing their educational pursuits after completion of a two-year degree program at KCC. Candidates must have a 3.3 cumulative GPA, ACT of 20 or higher, leadership experience, fewer than 24 credit hours of college credit completed. Deadline 4/7/2006— AAA Michigan's School Safety Patrol Scholarship program will award two graduating seniors \$1,000. Students must show documented proof of AAA Michigan School Safety Patrol participation, good academic standing and a strong record of involvement in the community and/or extracurricular activities. It will also be important for students to note what their Safety Patrol experience taught them or meant to them.
