Kindergarten Information Session and Open House

On Wednesday September 1st, I would like to meet with all Kindergarten parents and students who can attend in the gym here at Parkview at 5:30 to answer questions you may have about school.

At this time, I will give you an overview of the bus/pick up schedules, pick up doors, security, lunch and breakfast programs. I also will answer any other questions you may have. At 6:00, you may visit your child's

classroom, tour the building, and meet your child's teacher. I hope you will find this information helpful as your child becomes a student here at Parkview.



The Big Day

The Big Day is right around the corner! To help your child ease into the thought of coming to school, start now preparing him. The following are a few suggestions that may help:

- Tell your child in advance that he or she soon will be going to school.
- Be positive and reassure your child that school is a good place.
- Never use school as a threat or a means to change your child's behavior.
- Prepare for new school experiences by using puppets or by role-playing some enjoyable school activities.
- Read age-appropriate books about going to school to help your child know what to expect. Or work with your child to make a storybook about going to school.
- Prepare the night before by planning meals, clothes and transportation.
- Let your child bring a security object to school, like a stuffed toy, or give your child your photo to keep in his backpack.
- Visit your child's school during the Open House to meet his teacher.
- Play on the school playground before school starts.
- Start setting a routine now. Go to bed earlier everyday to help your child ease into the routine of getting ready for school.

Don't be too concerned if, in spite of your best efforts, your child cries and refuses to leave your side the first day of school while another youngster dismisses his or her parent with a wave of the lunch box. Clinging and crying are healthy coping mechanisms in very young children, so try not to overreact. Reassure your child that you will see him when school is over and that you can't wait to hear about his day. Your child's teacher will encourage your child to come into the classroom and this is the time when you give him a good-bye kiss and leave quickly. If your child sees you are alright with him staying at school, he will be alright, too. This can very hard, but your child's teacher is a veteran and reassure your child that you will come back. Once your child is engaged in the school day, he will feel comfortable and be on the road to a great school year.
