Charlotte Public School’s Results from the November 6, 2018 Election

The November 6, 2018 election has taken place and the Charlotte Public Schools bond proposal election results are as follows:

NO Votes - 4,226

YES Votes - 4,177

As indicated by the total votes, the Charlotte Public Schools bond proposal did not pass and lost by 49 votes. This is a slim amount, with over 8,400 votes cast in the election.

The bond proposal was asking tax payers for 29.85 million dollars and would have brought improvements and enhancements to all aspects of the school district.

The Board of Education will review the results and have a discussion regarding the bond election on Monday, November 12, 2018, at their next regular meeting.

Despite the results not being what we had hoped for, on behalf of the school district, I sincerely appreciate all the work and dedication put forth by the bond steering committee, our many community partners and the many individuals who have worked tirelessly for the past two years on the bond effort. I also want to thank our Board of Education for their work, support and vision for our school district.

Charlotte Public Schools also welcomes two new members to the Board of Education. Mrs. Marci Kohler and Mrs. Staci Gingrich were elected to the Board of Education on November 6th. Marci and Staci take office in January 2019 and each will serve a six year term representing the student and families of our school district. Congratulations to Marci and Staci.

Mrs. Julie Kimmer and Mr. Ron Schultheiss are stepping away from the Board of Education with their terms ending in December 2018.
